

## Notice on RPL Target Saturation

**Dated: 5<sup>th</sup> June 2017**

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) 2016-2020 intends to recognize the existing skill sets and prior experience of the current workforce and provide certification for the same. RPL is currently being implemented centrally through the Central Sponsored Centrally Managed Component of the Scheme by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).

The Scheme aims to assess and certify 40,00,000 candidates under RPL during its 4-year tenure (2016-2020). The target distribution across 36 states/UTs over 4 years is detailed in the Annexure 1 of the Guidelines for State Engagement under PMKVY (2016-2020). To ensure adequate coverage of the Scheme across sectors, the targets also have been distributed amongst the 40 functioning sectors.

Post 1-year implementation of the Scheme, a state-wise and sector-wise analysis was conducted. The outcome of this analysis was approved by the 8<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2017 and is presented in the table below.

Project Implementing Agencies/SSCs interested in applying for RPL under PMKVY are requested to make note of the approved outcomes. Any further changes to target allocation shall be uploaded on the PMKVY official website ([www.pmkvyofficial.org](http://www.pmkvyofficial.org)).

**Table 1: Outcome of Target Analysis as Approved by 8<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee**

1.	As per the analysis conducted ( <i>Annexure 1: RPL Target Saturation Index</i> ), it is seen that 2 sectors (Apparel and Rubber) have exceeded the Scheme targets of 2 years. To control the skewness in target allocation, and ensure increased participation from other sectors, project proposals under Project Type 1 from Apparel and Rubber sectors shall be put on hold till 30 <sup>th</sup> September 2017. Only projects from Apparel and Rubber sectors under Type 2 (RPL at Employer's Premises), whereby industry demand is clearly established, shall be processed.
